From the Principal's desk...

Last week we welcomed a new Year 2 student, Leelan to our school. He has come to us from near Cowra. We look forward to him being part of our wonderful little school.

Coonamble Aboriginal Health Service will be conducting their annual checks on all students in the first week of May. All students have been given permission notes that are to be filled in and returned as soon as possible. Each child must have their own form filled in.

SWAP IT program

Welcome to SWAP IT! SWAP IT supports you to make informed choices about your child's health and wellbeing.

Breakfast club

The school has recently been successful in receiving funding to run a daily breakfast club for all students. It will run from 8:30 until around 8:50am. Students will be able to choose from cereal and toast most days and occasionally they will be offered pancakes, bacon and eggs. As a result of this, morning play will now occur down under the Infants COLA. Breakfast is the most important meal of the day and it is vital that all students have it, as this will assist their learning and concentration in class. It is wonderful to see that all students are using this program!

Attendance Matters

Please be aware that it is important that students are at school every day. Obviously if your children are sick, please keep them at home, however reasons such as couldn't find shoes, sleeping in and if it is raining are not justifiable. Students who fall under 85% attendance will be referred to the Home School Liaison Officer for follow up. It is anticipated that students should be at school 95% of the time. Please find attached more information about why attendance is important. Students who display exemplary attendance will be rewarded at the end of the year.

Canberra Excursion

The Canberra excursion is planned for Week 7 of Term 4 this year, 15th-19th November. Students will be travelling in the school bus and will be staying in 2 bedroom apartments in Manuka. There will be a staff member in each room with each family of children. The cost will be \$330 per student., the school is heavily subsidising the excursion as well. All money must be paid by Friday November 5 2021. Payment plans are available. By paying as little as \$15 per student a week, the excursion will be paid for by 5/11.

Our next school radio show will take place on Thursday 11th March around 9:30am.

Sport on Thursdays

Sport will be held here at school on Thursday afternoons with Pilliga PS. We look forward to them joining us! Students must be wearing their full sports uniform on Thursdays-no football shorts.

School money envelopes

Homework



Students in Years 1-6 have been given spelling homework which must be completed and handed in on a Friday. Students will be allowed to keep the iPads at home that they used throughout the Learning from Home time. They are required to read a PM book every night and record it. They are also required to complete either 1 map in Reading eggs/Reading eggspress or 1 map in Maths seeds every night. It is important that students complete this as it supports what they are learning at school. This should take approximately 30 minutes to complete.

- working with the school to encourage and support regular attendance.








School attendance


Regular attendance at school is important!
